

At the Alumnae Brunch on December 3, 2016, Dr. Joyce Finch Johnson was named an honorary sister of the Spelman College Glee Club in recognition for her long-term service to Spelman College and to the Spelman College Glee Club

"It is such an honor to be present today to recognize one of the greatest women I've been blessed to know--Dr. Joyce Finch Johnson.

Dr. Johnson first graced Spelman with her multiple gifts in 1953 when she joined the college's music department. Just two years later in 1955, Dr. Johnson became the college organist and today, she is one of Spelman's warmest and most recognizable faces. In fact, when someone says the name Spelman, they follow-up with the name Dr. Joyce Johnson.

In a conversation with one of Dr. Johnson's former students, she stated "She is the reason why I'm involved in music today. I actually came to Spelman as a psychology major. I came to the music department just wanting to take piano lessons. I went to see her and she said, 'Oh no sweetie, you just have to be a music major.' She has always seen the potential in me that I didn't' see in myself. She's been the pinnacle and the reason behind every major event of my life."

I think I can speak for most, if not all of us present today when I say that there is no one who has shown the love, support, and dedication to Spelman College like Dr. Johnson. And for that, Dr. Johnson, we love you!"
