

Her mother, Rebecca Young, graduated from Spelman in 1994 and was a member of the Soprano 2 section of the Glee Club. Summer's aunt, Jill Harris, is also a Spelman College Glee Club alumna. She graduated in 2009 and was a member of the Alto 2 section. Summer's favorite Glee. Club memory is the sister social and singing in her first Annual Spelman-Morehouse Christmas Carol Concert.

Farris Christine Watkins is a sophomore music major from Atlanta, Georgia. She is the daughter of Dr. Angela Farris Watkins and Mr. Willie A. Watkins. Farris is a Spelman College and Spelman College Glee Club Legacy. Her grandmother, Ms. Christine King Farris, was a member of the Spelman College Glee Club during her time at Spelman. Farris has been featured in numerous events as a singer including the *Atlanta* Hawks basketball game where she sang the national anthem, the Emmy Awards Lifetime



Achievement Program in New York where she sang a special tribute to Ambassador Andrew J. Young, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Annual Freedom Fund Dinner. She has published two original songs, *We Pray* and *We Grow*, distributed nationally by Urban Ministries, Inc. As an orator, Farris is regularly sought after to speak at Youth programs, at local churches, and around the community. She has served many years as host and mistress of ceremonies for The King Center's Annual King Week Youth Expo and youth speaker at the annual televised Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commemorative Service. Farris' civic and social memberships are reflective of her leadership skills and interest in community service. Farris is a volunteer with the Atlanta Music Project, where she teaches young children about the art of music. She also regularly participates in campus service projects at Spelman, including homeless simulations, marches for justice, health walks, and political forums. Farris is committed to a path of academic excellence and positive social change.

Alumnae

Dr. Sakinah A. Davis, a graduate of the Spelman College class of 2009, was a Music major with a vocal concentration. While at Spelman, Davis was a member of the Spelman College Glee Club. One of her fondest Glee memories is singing in her very first Sister Social with her fellow Glee sisters as a first year student. In 2006, also during her first year at Spelman, in the midst of the Glee Club reunion Davis remembers feeling like she was a part of something so special. In that moment she realized that the Spelman College Glee club was a sisterhood within a sisterhood. Davis stated in an interview that she "wanted to sing black music for black people" and being a member of the Spelman College Glee Club allowed her to do just that. Dr. Davis is also Spelman College legacy and Spelman College Glee Club genesis. Her oldest sister graduated in 2005, her younger sister in 2012, and her youngest sister in 2016. Both of Dr. Davis's younger sisters continued in her footstep and became member of Spelman College Glee Club. Currently Dr. Davis works as an adjunct professor in the Department of Music at Spelman College, giving back to the place that gave her so much.

Dr. Darnita Killian, graduate of the class of 1979 is a native of Atlanta, Georgia. She sang in the soprano 2 section with the Spelman College Glee Club all four years at Spelman. While in the Glee Club, Dr. Killian held the position of Secretary on the Executive Board the last few years of her time as a student. Post graduation, she received her MBA from Atlanta University, in 1982.



Afterwards, she worked at Spelman as a Resident Director and it was then, that she found her passion for education. She went on to complete a fellowship at Harvard University and received her doctorate of education from the University of San Francisco. Dr. Killian then moved to New York and worked as the Vice President of Student Affairs at Pace University before coming back to Spelman. Currently, Dr. Killian serves as the Vice President of Student Affairs and has held this position since her return to Spelman in 2010. Among her other accomplishments, Dr. Killian has completed two Fullbright programs, the first in Germany in 1997 and the second in 2008 in Japan. Dr. Killian not only graduated and works at Spelman, but she is also a Spelman College and Spelman College Glee Club legacy. In her office at Spelman, she keeps a copy of her Great Aunt Maddie Neal's diploma, who graduated in 1897, with a degree from the Spelman Seminary. Since then, 16 of Dr. Killian's family members have attended Spelman and she was the 12th to graduate. We acknowledge and thank Dr. Darnita Killian for her continued love and support of Spelman College and the Spelman College Glee Club.


